06/02/1995: United States Air Force Captain Scott O'Grady's F-16is shot down over Bosnia while patrolling the NATO no-fly zone. The downed U.S. Air Force pilot Captain Scott O'Grady is rescued by U.S. Marines in Bosnia on June 8.

06/14/1995: After OPEC's semi-annual meeting in Vienna, President Ida Bagus Sudjana discloses the Organization's intention to roll over its present crude oil production ceiling of 24.52

million barrels per day (3,898,000m³/d). The announcement is followed by a trip to Norway by Saudi Arabian Oil Minister Hisham M. Nazer. Upon arriving, the Saudi Minister asks Norwegian Minister of Industry and Energy Jens Stoltenberg to restrain his country's oil production in the hopes of stabilizing world oil prices. (FT, DJ)

06/24/1995: "Rugby World Cup final": South Africa defeats New Zealand, Nelson Mandela presents Francois Pienaar with the Webb-Ellis trophy in an iconic post-apartheid moment.

06/26/1995: Attempted assassination of Egyptian president Hosni Mubarak in Addis Ababa.

06/29/1995: The Sampoong Department Store collapses in the Seocho-gu district of Seoul, South Korea, killing 501 and injuring 937. Space Shuttle program: STS-71Mission (Atlantis) docks with the Russian space station Mir for the first time.

06/30/1995: Exxon signs a \$15.2-billion deal to develop oil and gas fields near Russia's Sakhalin Island. The Sakhalin I project will develop the offshore Shayvo, Odoptu, and Arkutun-Dagi fields that together are estimated to contain 2.5 billion barrels (400,000,000m³) of crude oil and 15trillion cubic feet (420km³) of natural gas. Exxon has a 30 percent stake in the project. (NYT, DJ)
